FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

It is February, and I have two worship opportunities to share with you. First, believe it or not, Lent is almost upon us. Lent, a 40-day season starting on Ash Wednesday and concluding on Holy Thursday, prepares us to receive anew the promises of Easter. During Lent, we are encouraged to read scripture, serve others, and practice self-control through fasting. Whether you have observed Lent previously or not, you have likely heard of the practice of "giving something up for Lent." To intentionally abstain from something

you consume — certain foods, impulsive purchasing, time spent watching television, or other forms of entertainment — are forms of fasting. Fasting during Lent deepens our communion with God, focusing on prayer, repentance, and gratitude while enhancing spiritual reliance and obedience to God. Lent can be a spiritually rich season that helps people of faith focus on what is most important in life — our relationship with the Lord




— by abstaining from activities and behaviors that often distract us from that primary relationship. This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 14, so Lent begins on Valentine's Day! While I don't yet know the exact message for that service, I trust that the union of Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day will provide the opportunity for some interesting and perhaps enlightening reflection. So, I hope you will join me for our Ash Wednesday service on February 14 at 8:00pm in the Meeting House or online as we begin our prayerful journey with Jesus that will take us to the foot of the Cross and ultimately to the entrance of the Empty Tomb.

The other worship opportunity I invite you into is our Sunday Evening Worship services, which will be offered in the Chapel on the first Sunday of the month from February through June. Over the years, I have had church members approach me and ask if it might be possible to have a worship service at a time other than Sunday morning. Honestly, I have resisted this suggestion for a couple of reasons; first, we worship on Sunday morning because of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday, and no matter how many or how few people show up, we gather on Sunday morning to proclaim to the world that on a Sunday morning many years ago, death was defeated and the promise of eternal life was extended to us all. My other reservation about an alternative service time is my skepticism that people who struggle to find time on Sunday morning for worship will be able to make time during the evening.



Practicing What Jesus Preached

Please join us in a Lenten journey of reflection, practice, and prayer. Chapin's latest book leads us devotionally through the Sermon on the Mount, the most famous teachings of Jesus. Reading Monday through Friday during Lent, the 31 days of the book take us from Ash Wednesday up to Maundy Thursday when our special services begin. Stewardship Update

Our 2024 Stewardship Campaign is making positive strides toward our goal, though we still have a ways to go. This year, we have aspired to reach 425 financial pledges. For over three decades, The Congregational Church of New Canaan has had a mission to create a community in which youth can experience and share the love of God. All year, we have continued to walk with Christ to create a community for our youth marked by love, covenant, and participation.

This February, 108 of our YG fish will embark on a truly life changing pilgrimage to San Juan, Puerto Rico to work with our partner, *First Baptist Church of Río Piedras* to serve those brothers and sisters in need. In 2017, the Caribbean Island of Puerto Rico was devastated by Hurricane Maria. Over 40,000 families lost their roofs, their feeling of safety, their investment and security, and their homes. Estimates vary, but there are still more than 25,000 families that need help to rebuild and go on with their lives. For the past few years, our partners, *First Baptist Church of Río Piedras*, have hosted teams that have completed over 354 roofs and 8 houses. In addition to past and current hurricane damage, there are elderly poor in the area who need help with home repairs. Our trip this year will continue the work our adults began last year with

these wonderful partners as they work their way through the storm damage and poverty in Puerto Rico.

Their vital work and mission can only be accomplished with the help of volunteer groups like YG. YG provides a space for the spirit to move and allows our youth the opportunity to foster a greater relationship with God and one another. Today I ask you to join us as a mission sponsor. Our YG families pay a fee to participate, but that fee covers only about half the actual cost of this trip. Your donation will not only help provide housing, food, and other needs but, more importantly, make this trip possible for our Mission Fish in need of scholarships.



Give the Gift of Empathy

This past November, our Stephen Ministers gathered to talk about empathy. The discussion was guided by the book *The Gift of Empathy* by Joel Bretscher and Kenneth Haugk. Empathy is at the core of Pastoral Care and it is what our ministry teams strive to offer to our church family. In fact, in many ways, giving the gift of empathy is the best way for all of us to love our neighbors as God loves us.




Here are a few takeaways from the book.

- Empathy is not something you have; it is something you give.
- Empathy is looking at a situation from someone else's perspective to experience how they are feeling and to affirm them.
- A simple, empathetic response is usually the most effective way to comfort someone who is suffering.
 - "I'm so sorry;"
 - "That must have been awful;"
 - "My heart goes out to you;"
 - "I'm feeling your pain."
- Empathy is understanding what another person is experiencing while staying in control of your own emotions. Being stable allows you to be helpful and to compassionately let someone know that they are not alone. By encouraging them to share their feelings, you give them the opportunity to release them. Empathy is about active listening, not about advising or trying to fix a situation.
- The person receiving empathy feels understood, valued, accepted, encouraged, and cared for.
- The person giving empathy builds stronger and more meaningful relationships with family, friends, and coworkers; empathy helps us expand our own perspectives, grow personally, and feel less pressure to "fix" things. Empathy enriches others' lives as well as our own.

Fellowship Supper Club

Save the Date: Saturday, March 23

We are a large and active church, and one of the joys and challenges of being in a large church is that there is always someone new to meet! Our Supper Club can foster opportunities to make friends with other wonderful people outside our usual social circles.

What is Supper Club? Supper Club is a guided potluck dinner at a host's home, where a group of people meets in an informal and relaxed setting. It's great for newcomers and long-timers.

Who can participate? All adults who attend our church (members and visitors) are invited to participate!

How does it work? Save the date! We will gather on Saturday, March 23. Everyone who signs up for a dinner will be grouped with 6 to 8 other people. Each person or couple will be assigned a dish or a role that will contribute to a complete dinner (host, appetizer, main course, dessert, etc.). On the day of the dinner, you prepare your dish, grab an adult beverage to share (if desired), and head to your host's home to enjoy an evening of food and fellowship!

Who figures out when and where our supper club will gather? Multiple small dinners will occur on March 23. When you sign up, the club's coordinator, Dawn Doak, will reach out with your assignment the week of the dinner. If you



are willing to host the dinner in your home, you can indicate that on the sign-up form (hosts don't need to cook! They are just responsible for setting the table and serving non-alcoholic beverages).

What if I can't cook? You don't need to be a gourmet cook! The recipes are designed to be easy and great for groups.

What if I'm a vegetarian, lactose/gluten intolerant, or allergic to garbanzo beans? There is a place to list all your dietary restrictions on the online form. The coordinator and hosts will be informed of your needs and will work with the group to make sure there are options for you.




Adult Confirmation
