# news (a) God's ACRE

Sisters and Brothers,

This fall I'm taking the UCC Polity course at Yale. That means I'm learning a lot about the history of the four Christian denominations that comprise the United Church of Christ. Recently, the class took a tour of downtown New Haven and the Jonathan Edwards Center at Yale. Edwards may be best known for his classic must-read sermon titled: Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God.

From the Pastor's Study

It was interesting to learn that the green at the center of New Haven was the Congregationalists settlement when they first arrived in the area. They placed the original meeting house in the center of the green symbolizing the centrality of Jesus Christ in the development of their community.

In my first reflection paper, due in a few days, I'm being required to frame out a provisional definition of the UCC and what it means to minister in it. I don't know exactly how I will define the UCC. I suspect it will come together at the last minute. However, the assignment has me reflecting on the fact that the Jesus movement in the book of Acts is often referred to as "the Way" (Acts 9:2, 19:9, 24:14). That term may stem from what Jesus said to Thomas:



Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (John 14:6).

In order to do anything, one needs a way to do it. One needs a way to grow in faith or to put one's faith into action. In my reflection paper, I may suggest the UCC denomination is "a way" to establish a community in which people can live out their faith in worship and service. I don't believe it is a perfect way. Every denomination has its strengths and weaknesses. It is not a way that appeals to all people, but it is a way that emphasizes following Jesus as faithfully as possible. It is a way that also emphasizes being open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

This church year, through the production of our "Bible Top 40: Bible Stories Everyone Should Know" booklet and our expansion of men's and women's small groups, we are exploring "a way" to assist our church members in growing in faith and serving God. By reading and reflecting on the Bible story for each Sunday, you can engage in faith formation even if you can't be with us on Sunday morning.

We hope you will take advantage of the booklet and give weekly devotional time a chance. I also encourage you to join us for worship when possible. Continued on page two



The Mighty Minnows are excited to kick off another year of Youth Group!




YG Seniors welcome underclassmen during our Kick-off Carnival this September!



Everyone knows that at some point their physical life on earth will end. What kind of death would you like to have? Will your survivors know your wishes? In the midst of their grief, will they be struggling to find out crucial information? Often we put off planning for death indefinitely because we are "not old yet." Or we just are uncomfortable thinking about it. But it's something that every adult needs to think about!

The panel will provide guidance to parents and their adult children on how to orchestrate a family conversation which ensures that final wishes will be honored, and will outline the purpose of various legal and medical directives, as well as options for end-of-life care. Real life stories will be shared.
