

Spotlight on Pacific House

The mission at Pacific House is to prevent and end homelessness. The agency provides fundamental needs of food and shelter while offering short-term, solution-focused case

management services (free to clients), which help them access community resources to secure stable housing quickly. While Pacific House is focused on housing the homeless in Fair-



field County, the agency also helps individuals get back to school or find employment to help them ultimately afford housing and help reduce the homeless population in Connecticut.

The agency has two core focal points, an emergency shelter and deeply affordable housing. The Stamford-based Emergency Shelter typically serves 60-85 guests each night but often serves 100 or more during winter. It operates 365 days, 24 hours per day, and provides breakfast, lunch, and dinner daily. The deeply affordable housing projects are a powerful example



of collaboration between the federal government, state, and town.

During Fiscal Year 2022, Pacific House will have doubled housing capacity from just two years ago (this

during a pandemic). This past year, the agency provided over 95,000 meals to shelter residents, the most in the agency's history. In addition, Pacific House diverted 108 individuals from coming into the shelter, averting their potential to become homeless. This is more than double the number of diversions from the previous year. Two case managers handle their Young Adult Program caseload and, since its inception, have helped over 150 Young Adults ages 18 – 24.

Pacific House advocacy is making a difference, and The Congregational Church of New Canaan is proud to support its efforts. Larry Servin, MSA liaison to Pacific House



Pacific House Monthly Service

Once a month (every third Thursday) our church provides and serves dinner at the Pacific House Homeless Shelter in Stamford. Volunteers are needed to both contribute food items and serve a hot meal to the approximately 40 men residing at the shelter. [All Covid protocols are observed.]

These men always express their sincere gratitude for our hearty meal (usually ziti!) and in serving them, we truly see the face of Jesus.

Meals on Wheels Engagement Opportunity

Many of our members delivered once a month on a Thursday in a team or individually. We want to recommit to these regular routes together again. All volunteers must be vaccinated, but there are no age limits. 



Stephen Ministers are here for You!

With our new class of trained Stephen Ministers in the spring, we currently have more than a dozen Stephen Ministers waiting for care receivers.

A message from Todd Baker & Bently Elliott, Co-Head Ushers

We all know that giving is better than receiving, and the wonderful thing about ushering is that we can give (by serving our church) and receive (by attending our wonderful services) at the same time! Ushering is a great way to stay in touch with the congregation, get closer to clergy and church leaders, and also a great entry point that can lead to other forms of church service. Because the commitment is on Sunday morning, work conflicts are rare, and if you are already a frequent attendee, the time commitment is incremental in the sense that you arrive a little earlier and leave a little later. It's easy, fun, and most importantly, fulfilling.

We basically have three types of ushers:

Rotational Team Members:

Regular commitment once a month and front line opportunity to substitute for others when necessary

Super Subs:

People who are regularly away or have frequent Sunday conflicts and can't commit to monthly service, but who like to serve whenever possible, often on short notice, and are proactive about their ability to serve on a given Sunday

Regular Subs:

People who are regularly away or have frequent Sunday conflicts and prefer to have their potential service solicited in advance so they can manage their time
