FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

We enter a new year full of possibility and promise, with the lingering effects and upticks of the COVID pandemic. Personally, I will be so grateful when a newsletter of mine doesn't have to include notes about viral illness! But we are where we are, and I want to let you know the plans on the horizon.

1. We will stay safe and stay open. We believe in the efficacy of vaccinations, as well as, social distancing and masking. We believe we can faithfully and safely continue offering in-person worship and program activities. We know that the wave of emotional and psychological health concerns that may be more acute than physical health issues at the moment can be eased by in-person fellowship, connection, and a commitment to be with one another.



- 2. We will maintain and strive to enhance all virtual connections. We realize that many folks in our community may need to participate in our church at a distance because of work travel, family plans, or health concerns. We will ensure that our worship and programmatic events have effective and easy virtual access for all. The good news is that the next big Sunday snowstorm we have, church won't be cancelled; we will just be virtual! And, please remember, if our streaming capability is impacted by foul weather or New Canaan's notorious power outages, our new worship podcast will always be available to you!
- 3. We won't take unnecessary risks. While we are in a phase of the pandemic when serious illness and hospitalizations are exceptionally low thanks to the efficacy of vaccines, we want to avoid practices that might make COVID transmission more likely. We will take a break from fellowship activities that include food and drink until the end of the cold and flu season. We will pause our communion offerings until this next wave of COVID passes.

As we enter a new year, I want you to be aware of a new offering I will be making while asking you all to make an offering yourself. Starting January 3, the Monday Morning Message will focus on Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. I am working on a project entitled "Christian: Practicing What Jesus Preached," and I will record

sections of that work for your devotional use in the New Year. If we want a closer relationship with Jesus, it might be best to resolve to attempt to live as Jesus encourages us to.

Stewardship Update

Thank you to all who have already generously pledged to the Stewardship Campaign. We have had a healthy start and are hopeful that our community will continue to come together to support our church.

Over the course of 2021, Chapin and the church staff responded nimbly to the challenges of ministering to a disparate congregation that not only sustained us but also expanded our opportunities to serve God. AV equipment, for example, enabled weekly worship for our community and also expanded our ministry

to worshippers across the country that now join us regularly. It increased the vibrancy and reach of our Bible study classes and enabled easier access to worship for our disabled and elderly. Our youth programs persevered under tents and steadily provided essential community and connection for our kids whose schools and activities were so limited. Our outreach team stepped up to provide meaningful relief and resources not only for our mission partners but to a broader group of people whose meals and shelter were threatened by the economic fallout of the pandemic. Your stewardship support enabled all this and more.



Currently, we are at 233 pledge cards (66% of goal) for \$1,571,948 (89% of goal).

We are very grateful for the blessings of this community. Our church's ability to thrive during this challenging time is a reflection of our community's commitment and support.

If you have not yet pledged, could you please consider making a pledge to the Stewardship Campaign and, if possible, please consider increasing your commitment. Like our Pilgrim forebears, we are relying on all members of our church to help carry this extraordinary community through this challenging year into the upcoming season of promise and possibility.

About Our Mission To South Carolina!

We have \$75,000 to raise for our mission! Will you support our YG Fish?

This year, 74 of our YG fish will embark on a truly life-changing pilgrimage to Allendale, South Carolina to work with our partners, Together for Hope & Emma's House, to serve those brothers and sisters living in substandard housing.

Youth will be working to repair the homes of our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Allendale is a community that was once prosperous and thriving, but life in this community has drastically shifted over time. The town was once a tourist stopover on the way to coastal resorts. Once I-95 was built just a bit of a distance from the town, they saw a dramatic drop in guests coming through on their way to vacation. Since then, opportunities for employment and economic growth have ceased.

Residents of Allendale have no option but to make a long commute each day to Hilton Head, Charleston, and other resort areas to work. For parents, this makes caring for their children particularly difficult. Lottie and Frank Lewis are residents of Allendale who saw this great need for support for parents and took action to help their neighbors. We see God at work in Emma's House, the organization which the Lewis' founded in memory of Lottie's beloved Mother. Emma's House helps students with tutoring, skill-building, and general care while their parents are hard at work to make a living to provide for them. We are excited to partner with Emma's House and Together for Hope for our mission trip this year.

Both organization's missions can only be accomplished with the help of volunteer groups like YG. And we can't do it without sponsors like you!

YG fish will build a playground and safe outdoor space at Emma's House. Fish will also work on home repair projects for local community members in great need identified by Together for Hope!

The work that will be done together will be life-changing for those we will serve and for the YG members, and we invite you to join in this effort by making a Mission Sponsor contribution using the envelope included in this bulletin. Please prayerfully consider donating to support the outreach efforts of our youth. Mission Sponsors receive handwritten letters sent from the Mission Fish on-site, describing their day-to-day experiences. Religion & Environment Interfaith Event

Tuesday, February 1 7:00 – 9:00pm Meeting House & Livestream

Join the New Canaan Land Trust and Interfaith Council of New Canaan in an interfaith exploration of conservation and environmentalism. Centered around the three Abrahamic faiths, this program will explore the different ways that religion tasks us with protecting and stewarding the earth. We welcome community members of all faiths to join us either in-person or virtually.



The program will begin with a lecture from Drs. Mary Evelyn Tucker and John Grim, professors at Yale University, and Co-Directors of the Yale Forum on Religion and Ecology. Their presentation will link conservation and environmentalism to the teachings of many of the world's religions. Drs. Tucker and Grim will also help us to understand how different faiths interpret and and ask us to respond to the environmental issues that we face today.

Following the lecture, we will host a panel discussion with faith leaders from in and around New Canaan. The panel will be moderated by Reverend Stephanie Johnson, a former student of Drs. Tucker and Grim, who has spent many years working at the intersection of theology and environmentalism and facilitates faith-based environmental programs. 
