FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

I want to share our plans for Summer Worship on God's Acre with you. Starting on June 19, our Deacons have decided we will have one in-person service on Sunday mornings at 9:00am. We will worship in the Garden when weather permits; and indoors when inclement. We will continue to offer our God's Acre On the Go worship podcast and video each Sunday throughout the summer

so that we can stay connected wherever you are and wherever you are traveling.

Personally, I so love our two worship services during the program year. The 8:00am, and 10:00am services are varied and beautiful in their own unique ways. Those two services meet our needs well. However, when our travel increases and attendance eases a bit in the summer, the need for two services is not as necessary. Also, on hot summer Sundays, the Meeting House can be something of a



sauna. When visitors come to the 10:00am service as they church shop (most visits are in late August and early September), that very lightly attended service isn't particularly expressive of the vibrant community we are. Additionally, while having multiple services can meet various needs during the year, it also divides our church into two. I love the idea of coming together as one family of faith for our summer season!

Do not worry; we will always maintain our 8:00am and 10:00am services during the program year! However, we are excited to experiment with a 9:00am summer service in hopes of enhancing our sense of togetherness as a community. It will remain a service that is less than an hour in length, still early enough to allow for a full day of activities afterward, and accessible enough for children and young families to enjoy.

On a final and very hopeful note, we are scheduled for baptisms nearly every Sunday this summer. The new young families that moved into town during the pandemic have started to make their way to our church! Not only will all these baptisms be wonderful to witness during the summer, but it is also an opportunity for you to join me in welcoming these families into our community.

So, please join us for worship in the Garden at 9:00am from June 19-September 4. Enjoy a time of fellowship in the Parlor afterward, and please introduce yourselves and get to know some of the newest members of our church.

Pivot Ministries

The first phase of Pivot's program includes crisis intervention and stabilization, creating a safe, secure, supervised environment for healing and counseling. The students are engaged in a rigorous program with biblical principles, anger management, and conflict resolution classes while continuing with individual and group counseling. As the men grow spiritually, they experience brotherhood. Pivot students cultivate a broader sense of belonging through group and social activities. Each man is connected with a career path or educational goal. Each man learns how to live a disciplined Christian life and is encouraged to continue in an active way in his church and to serve.



During Lent thirteen of us came together to talk about things we believe at this particular moment, things that are pressing on our hearts, and committed to writing them down. A few if the resulting essays are being shared with you here. In this summer newsletter, you will find two essays. This I Believe | Amy Werner

On May 9th, 2006, 136 million babies were born in the world, the equivalent of 260 babies every minute. My twin sons, now teenagers, were also born on that bright spring day, in the season when nature itself is reborn and the *miracle of life* begins anew. *The miracle of life*. Miraculous and yet — so ordinary. As I held my newborns, amazed at the almost incomprehensible newness of life in my arms, I watched the waves of people outside on the busy New York City streets. Each of them, and all 8 billion people currently on Earth, let alone all generations before, *became life*. I wondered why there weren't parades and news flashes that these tiny humans, who weren't here on Earth that morning, were here now, with breath and the fullness of life ahead of them. Well, because like so many miracles, it was really quite ordinary.

Since miracles are commonplace, I often forget to serve as witness to them: The big and small beauty of the natural world around me, kindness that saves lives, human ambition and curiosity that drives progress. Looking from the 100th floor across the tops of Manhattan's skyscrapers at sunset is as breathtaking as standing on top of the Rocky Mountains after an upward hike. My kids tease me for saying every time, "Take a minute to enjoy the view," but they do look. And we look together, sometimes with a touch or lean as if to quietly say, "I see it, too. This miracle."


I believe that miracles are ordinary, commonplace and everywhere. All of it. Each of us. Everything we do.

With so much wonder, does it lose its meaning? We try to organize it so we can better comprehend it. Science and

medicine bring order to life, extend it, heal it, create it, all through the minds and hands of humans who have endeavored to be part of the miracle. That endeavor itself is a miracle. Humans look up into the vastness of the universe, study and classify it, and unbelievably travel through it. But so, too, when antibiotics cleared my daughter's ear infection, or chemotherapy cleared my father's lymphoma. The noble academic pursuit of asking *how* things happen, with proof that builds upon centuries of human understanding, ultimately bumps into the unanswered question of *why*. The signs of the miracle are all around us, are within us, are us.

If I were to witness someone turning water into wine I would certainly try to figure out the trick. Or if a thunderous God appeared before me with a message from above, I'm not sure I'd have the presence of mind to take it in. One busy school morning, while I was nudging 3 little kids to hurry up, my kindergartner kept asking me to lower my voice. Finally, he said, with frustration, "Mommy, please be quiet!" "What? Why?," I asked incredulous. "Because I'm trying to hear the quiet voice of God." I've never had a moment when God appeared to me, in any form, let alone a burning bush. But I've felt certainty, intuition, clarity, peace, love. I've been lucky and unlucky. I've also felt fear and anger at cruel injustice, inequality and suffering. In college I was a buddy to a 9 year old boy with brain cancer, and his family allowed me to gather with them around his bed and witness his last breaths. I don't know where his breath went. I was there, and I saw him stop breathing, but I do not fully know what happened to him. Mystery and miracle together.





Beyond Pride / Love is Love | Polly Morrow

Parents may be their children's first teachers, but I know I have learned more from my kids than I could have ever imagined. Kristin (now 17) and Alex (now nearly 15) are the lights of my life. Each year has been filled with adventures and surprises. It's been nothing short of fascinating watching

their lives unfold and seeing them grow into the fine the young adults they have become.

Our parenting journey was fairly typical until our youngest, just shy of 12, came out to us as transgender. He learned what that term meant on the internet when he was trying to find out why things felt so wrong. He had struggled with anxiety, panic attacks, hating the way his body was

developing through puberty, and feeling that he needed to hide who he truly was. His gender didn't align with the body that he was born with. He had felt miserable and broken. Hearing that other people were transgender, and realizing that he was, too, reassured him ... he wasn't alone, and there were things that could be done to alleviate his dysphoria.

When he let us know, it made complete sense. It was something we had contemplated given that he truly had always been a boy – all of his preferences and behaviors (clothing, activities, friendships) – were those of a typical boy. When we told him that we loved him and would help him get the care and support that he needed on this journey, it was as though

the weight of the world was lifted off his young shoulders. It was the first time we had seen him really smile in quite some time.

We went to church the next morning, and showed Alex our church's statement of inclusivity. We set up a meeting with our minister that week so that Alex could share his news, and could not have asked for a more supportive response. We read books, worked with our pediatrician, found a pediatric endocrinologist, reached

out to our local LGBTQ+ center to find counseling resources and support groups. Alex's puberty was put on a pause to allow him time to mature and process all of the implications of being transgender and to give us time to determine Alex's transition plans.

A year or later, Kristin let us know that they are gay, and a year after that, that they are nonbinary – somewhere in between on the gender continuum between male and female. Our reaction was the same – unconditional love. We know that gender and sexual orientation are part of who they are, and trust that they know who they are. We also know that things

may be fluid as they grow older and mature. Both what won't change is the unconditional support – because love is love.

I have so much to be thankful for. An incredible husband and co-parent. Two amazing, happy, thriving young adult children. Our wonderful church. Informed, expert medical and behavioral health resources that have helped us manage Alex's care. Our region's rich and vibrant LGBTQ+ community. Our children being part of a generation that understands that gender, gender expression and sexuality are not binary "choices" and that all in the spectrum are normal and beautiful. Political leaders who understand that our children are awesome, and love is love. To say that we are blessed is an understatement.


What: Celebrate Pride Month with this group formed to support each other and those we love by sharing resources, perspectives and experiences.
















Congratulations to the Cast and Crew of the Spring Musical!
