FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

Most of us are quite familiar with the stories of Jesus' expansive teaching and healing ministry. Jesus is said to have taught crowds of thousands while curing all manner of diseases. Jesus is even said to have fed the multitudes with a few loaves of bread and fish. What is perhaps even more astonishing is that in the gospel of John, Jesus lets his followers know that in his absence, through the power of the Holy Spirit, we will do "even greater works than these." [John 14:12]

As Christians, as members of Christ's Church, Jesus believes we can accomplish far more in our ministry than he was able to accomplish in His. There is deep historical truth to this contention, for the Church of Jesus Christ has ministered to the world for 2000 years, bringing faith, support, and healing to innumerable people and countless communities. Jesus was signaling that His church would have an expansive impact that no one in



first-century Palestine could have ever imagined.

We are blessed with a vital and growing community on God's Acre. We have not only made it through a pandemic together, but we have, through the grace and goodness of God, witnessed the expansion of so many of our ministries. Together with the assistance of the Holy Spirit, we have accomplished so much. Now what? That is the question for everyone in our church to consider this Stewardship Season. We have been doing really good work together, but scripture insists that there is more to come. Together, we are being called to even greater works than that which we have witnessed to date.

This Stewardship Season, I invite you not only to pray and discern what financial commitment you feel called to offer through the church, but I also ask you to reflect on what "greater work" the Lord might be calling us to in this next season of our life together as a church family. What do you believe the Lord desires of us at this time? What important work might God be calling us to in the future?

To this end, there is a goal for the church this year. We are hoping and praying to have 425 pledges made this year. 425 financial commitments to the church. 425 visions for greater work together.

THANKSGIVING SERVICE PROJECT

Sunday, November 19, 11:00am-12:30pm

On Sunday, November 19, our church will serve in one of its most beloved traditions, the Thanksgiving Service Project. We serve 140 families in neighboring towns in need. We will gather immediately after the 10:00am service in Smith Hall. We invite you to grab a box, decorate it, and then fill it with delicious food for a family to enjoy. Everyone in our church family is encouraged to participate in this all-church effort to feed our neighbors this Thanksgiving! Refreshments will be served at the conclusion of our packing event.



Church School

The children of our church are big contributors to our annual Thanksgiving Service project. All children received a "Turkey Bank" at the beginning of November and were encouraged to raise money through both acts of service and fundraising through family and friends. The money raised through Church School will contribute directly to the stipend provided to our Thanksgiving dinner recipients to purchase turkeys. Children will return their Turkey Banks to church on Sunday,

November 19. On that day, all church school classes will participate in the Thanksgiving Service Project during church school and following the service with their families.







Youth

Our Youth Groups will have their part in our annual Thanksgiving Service Project! Our Guppies will make hot cocoa jars with marshmallows, and JYG will pack cookies in a jar mix for families served by the project. YG Fish will do their annual part of the project by assisting as volunteers during the all-church packing event and then delivering the boxes to the local non-profits. The schedule of events is below.

Monday, November 13

JYG makes cookie mix jars at normal program time 4:15-5:30pm.

Tuesday, November 14

Guppies make cocoa jars at normal program time 3:30-4:30pm.

Sunday, November 19

MSYG fish are expected to be at the church by 9:30am to help the church schoolers prepare the boxes during the service. They will help in church school from 9:30-11:00am. This is a covenant event for all MSYG fish traveling on the Mountainside trip in June.

YG traveling Mission Fish are expected to sign up either as an individual to help with the Thanksgiving Service Project Event or with their families to deliver the completed Thanksgiving boxes in the afternoon. We kindly ask that if you have multiple children in the program, please plan to help deliver boxes. Each car should be able to fit 5 boxes in the trunk or back seat.

Drivers/Families should pull in the front circle during your allocated time slot, where you will be greeted by a YG advisor who will tell you what local non-profit you are delivering to. A Request from Israeli and Palestinian Friends in Israel and Palestine:

Navigating how to be an ally to Israelis and Palestinians is complex, and we encourage you to center on our shared humanity during this time. Continue to speak out against violence, and don't get swept up in talking points.

If you don't know what to say, know this.

Your Palestinian friends are looking to you to know you see their humanity and their right to a life without disenfranchisement.

Your Jewish friends are looking to you to know you do not support the loss of innocent Jewish lives and that their Jewish identity does not mean they support the actions of the Israeli government.

Your Palestinian friends are looking at you to demonstrate you don't equate their existence to Hamas and that additional innocent people shouldn't face starvation, continuous violence, and the stripping of their human rights.

Your Jewish friends also want you to know their grief may be complex, and they deserve time to process, and that their morning is not an endorsement of violence. Their fears and grief are valid and have a historical basis.

While there are loud extremists on all sides, there are even more people who are scared and trying to process, figuring out how to take action, how to grieve, and wondering how this cycle of violence can stop.

You can be critical of Hamas and the Israeli government while holding space and compassion for Jewish and Palestinian people. We need a solution that centers on humanity. We cannot continue to justify human rights violations, and we must confront the reality that the failure to solve this conflict has allowed tensions to boil over in a way that puts innocent people at risk.

Israelis and Palestinians who desire peace ask that you pray for peace for us all.


