FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

This newsletter is due a week before Christmas, so I am writing about a season I have yet to experience but one I am thoroughly looking forward to. I suspect I will mention this as I likely have before at the candlelight service, and it will probably come in the form of a recommendation.

Take advantage of the twelve days of Christmas as a time for deep reflection on your life, your faith, and the work the Lord is calling you

to participate in during the coming year. Whether you realize it or not, you will be on at least day eight when you read this. So, I am making a suggestion that is perhaps a bit too late for this year, but because it is so much on my mind and heart, I want to share it with you in the hope that perhaps you will remember the idea next year and plan accordingly.



So, I actually love resolutions. I have so many little notes to myself tucked

in special books and the different Bibles that remind me of how I have previously resolved to try to live. Each year, I attempt to further hone and further commit to the goals I have about how I want to live, work, eat, exercise, serve, learn, and play. The challenge is finding the time to really reflect each year. I have never really enjoyed being prompted by a new year and the changing of a date. As a person of faith, I really want to be led by some religious season or event. Advent and Lent are really fine candidates, but for me, they are seasons so busy I don't always feel like I can do my best personal praying and thinking.

However, a few years ago, I stumbled on this idea — I don't know how it came to me — that the twelve days that exist between Christmas Eve and Epiphany are an ideal time for life evaluation and faith reflection. I always seem to be in search of the next spiritual epiphany, so why not align it with the actual Epiphany? It is also a fairly restful and quiet time in the church and in our work and family lives. Once the craziness of Christmas has passed, although we do get some New Year's Resolution nudges in the middle of the stretch of days, we end with Wise Men arriving at their destination, having kept their eyes and attention trained on a star that led them to a Savior.

Twelve days of personal discernment, framed by significant Christian events, birth, and discovery, have been a true gift. This year, I will again pray for vocational clarity; where does the Lord want me to focus my efforts in the coming year? I will consider anew matters of health and wellness and how to live a more well-balanced life. I will take time to think deeply about what I want to learn this year and how I might be called to serve in ways I may have overlooked previously. And, by Epiphany, I will have created a new list of aspirational and spiritual goals and resolutions, if you will, for myself for the coming year.

That is what I am currently doing as you read this. Perhaps you are, too, if you caught my encouragement on Christmas Eve. If not, you could take the next four days to do a little special soul work yourself. Or, put a note in your calendar for next year to spend the Twelve Days of Christmas as a time of prayer and reflection that can offer some direction and definition for the coming year. And, perhaps, if you are willing, you might offer a prayer for me as I look forward to where the Lord's illuminating presence might lead me as your pastor this coming year.


Filling in the Blanks Packing Event

YOUTH MINISTRIES

Join us for YG Commissioning Sunday!

On Sunday, January 7, we will commission 108 YG Mission Fish to serve over their February break with our mission partner, First Baptist Church of Río Piedras, in San Juan, Puerto Rico! We invite you to join us for this special worship service as we pray for the people of Puerto Rico, our YG Fish, and the relationships to come, which can only be fostered through God's unconditional love! For 33 years, our congregation has supported YG in their efforts to be agents of change in our world; we look forward to sharing this Sunday with you.





For 32 years, The Congregational Church of New Canaan has had a mission to create a community where youth can experience and share the love of God. We have continued to walk with Christ all year to create a community for our youth marked by love, covenant, and participation.

This February, 108 of our YG fish will embark on a truly life-changing pilgrimage to San Juan, Puerto Rico, to work with our partner, *First Baptist Church of Río Piedras*, to serve those brothers and sisters in need. In 2017, the Caribbean Island of Puerto Rico was devastated by Hurricane Maria. Over 40,000 families lost their roofs, their feeling of safety, their investment and security, and their homes. Estimates vary, but there are still more than 25,000 families that need help rebuilding and going on with their lives. For the past few years, our partners, *First Baptist Church of Río Piedras*, have hosted teams that have completed over 354 roofs and eight houses. In addition to past and current hurricane damage, there are elderly people in the area who need help with home repairs. Our trip this year will continue the work our adults began last year with these wonderful partners as they work their way through the storm damage and poverty in Puerto Rico.

Their vital work and mission can only be accomplished with the help of volunteer groups like YG.

YG provides a space for the spirit to move and allows our youth the opportunity to foster a greater relationship with God and one another. Today, I ask you to join us as a mission sponsor. Our YG families pay a fee to participate, but that fee covers only about half the actual cost of this trip. Your donation will not only help provide housing, food, and other needs but, more importantly, make this trip possible for our Mission Fish in need of scholarships.

God's work can only be accomplished with the help of volunteer groups like YG. And we can't do it without sponsors like you! Will you be a Mission Sponsor?
