### Biography

Darryl Abraham and his art are well known in the community of Naples, New York. His sculptures and drawings of farmhouses, stores, boats, and landscapes celebrate the history of the Finger Lakes region, and his artwork can be found on store signs and murals throughout the town. Abraham has taught at many colleges and universities around New York state, including as an adjunct instructor at Mansfield University, Cazenovia College, Wells College and Finger Lakes Community College; as well as most recently taking a visiting artist position at the American International School in Israel.

He also ran a landscape business for several years, carrying on a family tradition of nurturing the land as encouraged by his parents, Doc & Katy Abraham, well-known for their nationally syndicated radio show, The Green Thumb. Since retiring, Darryl now concentrates full time on his art.

Our plate collection for the month is Inspirica. Inspirica is one of the largest providers of services to the homeless and those facing housing insecurity in Connecticut, and the largest in lower Fairfield County. Each night, they house approximately 475 people, and each year, they serve more than 3,000 people. They operate 12 facilities in lower Fairfield County and provide an extensive array of support services, including vocational training, workforce education, job placement, housing placement, job & housing retention support, early childhood & parenting services, children's services, counseling, case management, and much more. Inspirica is one of only a handful of organizations in the nation that address the physical components of homelessness and housing insecurity and the underlying root causes on a single, powerful end-to-end platform. 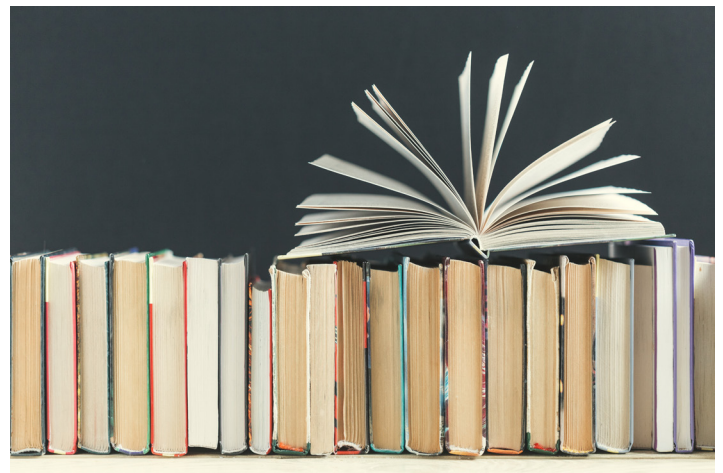
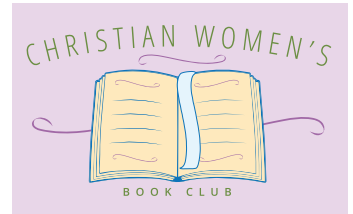

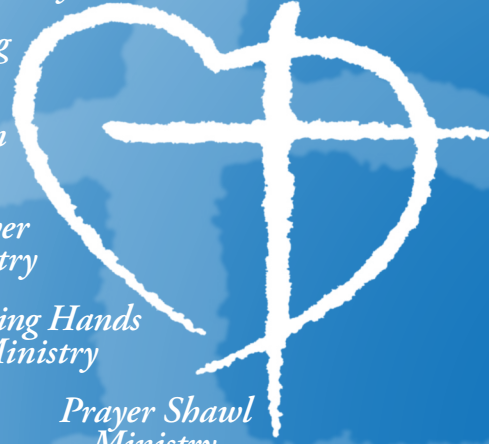

## Maasai Mission Trip to Kenya

### The History

The Maasai Mission is our congregation's living memorial to the victims of 9/11. In the midst of mourning, caring for the bereaved, lifting up the first responders, and realizing something had forever changed in our lives, we too felt called to respond. Out of a congregational meeting came the idea of shoring up an at-risk community, partnering with them, and together displacing evil with good. The partners we found were in Kenya, within the heart of the Christian and Muslim shared world. The first project was a water pipeline, the substance of life and a powerful metaphor for the path we were trying to walk. And so we began with a water walk to Mead Park, which seemed to hold past and future, near and far, heaven and earth in its moment of hope.

Our church has now partnered with Simba Maasai Outreach Organization (SIMOO) in Kenya for 20 years to substantially improve the lives of Maasai residents in East African villages. Women no longer walk miles for their water. Therefore, their children no longer must stay behind and care for the livestock but are able to go to school, a school that is funded by a dedicated group of our parishioners. When arriving home from school, the children have a better chance at a meal, thanks to the irrigation projects for vegetables and the women's chicken business for eggs, both also providing some income where there was none. Drought-resistant goats survive the now

longer periods of drought, and solar panels provide light at night for students to keep up in school. These and other projects our church has supported have gone a long way towards addressing the most urgent needs of the Maasai: water, food sustenance, and education. Our goal is to help this community become self-sustaining, become a model, and then spread the programs like ripples on a pond to surrounding communities.

### The Mission

This year's mission will be to help build a clinic in the village of Ilngarooj. When people are sick, they often do not get treatment due to the long walk to receive healthcare. Often, children are not vaccinated for TB, Polio, and additional diseases largely eradicated in other parts of the world. Women give birth at home to avoid difficult travel to reach a further clinic. The new clinic will address all these things. It will include a consultation room, a pharmacy, a lab, an injection room, and labor, delivery, and neonatal care rooms. After the clinic is built, it will be free for residents, staffed, and run by the government. An equally important part of our mission is to be in relationship with the Maasai community. We will have a chance to see the projects in action we have helped to bring about and to meet the Maasai people we have partnered with on them.

# Nominating and Governance

The Nominating and Governance Committee (N&G-C) is delighted to announce two new developments. First, responding to the Deacons and Trustees establishing a new Music Committee, the N&G-C worked with multiple constituencies to develop a slate of candidates to fill the Music Committee ranks. Both processes followed the requirements set forth in our church bylaws.

The Music Committee is comprised of nine members with three members rotating off each year and replaced by new members serving three-year terms. The rotation of membership is consistent with most of the other committees of the church. In addition, a high school or college-aged youth member of the church will serve one-year terms. The youth member will constitute a tenth member. Due to the midyear start of the Music Committee, the first wave of members will serve until the March 2025 Annual Meeting.

In accordance with our church bylaws, The N&G-C developed a candidate slate and voted in favor of electing the new members. This slate will be presented to the Congregation at the next Annual Meeting for consideration and ratification.

## Welcome Nerva Altino Director of Music Ministries

Nerva is a graduate of the Manhattan School of Music, where he received his Master's Degree in Music, and of Atlantic Union College, where he received a Bachelor's Degree in piano, with an emphasis in Sacred Music and Pipe Organ Studies. He immigrated to New York City from Haiti with his family as a child and grew up in Queens. His father was a church pianist who encouraged Nerva's love of music at a young age, and along with his brother, Nerva is part of a piano duo known as the Altino Brothers. Together, they've been blessed to perform in such prestigious venues as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Yale University's Woolsey Hall and The Library of Congress, and have also appeared on numerous television programs including CBS NY Sunday Morning, NBC's Today Show and the TBN Hour of Power in the Crystal Cathedral.

Nerva also has over 35 years of experience as a church organist, including over 25 years as a Music Director/Choral Leader, and his goal has always been to serve God wherever he makes music. He served for twelve years as the Director of Music Ministry at Alexandria Presbyterian Church in Milford, NJ, and as the Director of Music Ministry for the past nine years at his home church, the Linden Seventh Day Adventist



Church in Laurelton, New York. He also has deep experience working with and teaching music to children, in both church choirs and through private instruction. Nerva currently resides in Brooklyn, NY with his wife, Jelaine, and they have two adult daughters.

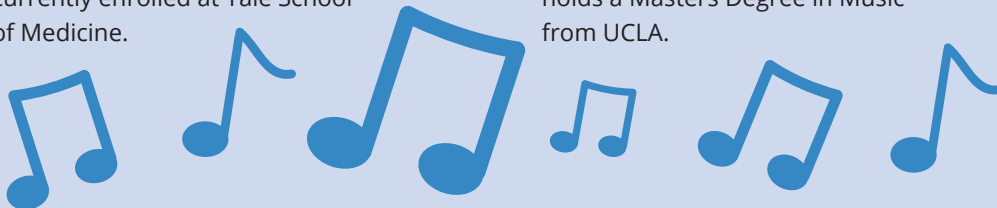

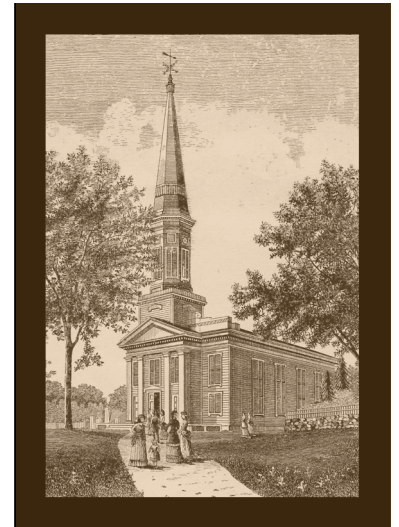


## HISTORY MINISTRY TEAM
