FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

After a particularly enriching and demanding fall and early winter season in the life of the church, I am preparing to take some time away for rest and renewal.

I want to begin by reflecting on how remarkable this season has been. We started our program year by addressing profound tragedies in our town, playing a central role in providing resources and care for our community. Throughout the fall, we experienced increased engagement in many of our programs and ministries, including a wonderful uptick in attendance at our Sunday evening worship services.

Having Nerva Altino join our music program has been an extraordinary gift. His presence has brought the desired variety to our musical offerings and has dynamically connected our children's, youth, and adult music programs to one another. In addition, we launched two search committees, began work on a new preschool program, and hosted Christmas on God's Acre, playing host to our entire town as is our custom on Christmas Eve.

Even during what is often our "winter lull," we've seen sustained engagement and attendance. This was especially evident on Youth Commissioning Sunday, where we covenanted with 105 youths for their mission trip in a "standing room only" Meeting House.

Time and again this season—through joyful moments and challenging ones—I've found myself thanking and praising God for the great gift and extraordinary honor of being part of what the Holy Spirit is doing in our community.




Now, I am ready for a bit of a rest. In February, I will travel to meet our friends and mission partners in Israel. While we canceled our group trip due to the war and the closure of many sites, I kept my February ticket with the hope of a safe opportunity for rest and spiritual renewal. Conditions remain tense, but the ceasefire, recent geopolitical developments in neighboring countries, and Israel's efforts to stabilize the region have alleviated direct threats within Israel itself. My friends anticipate that pilgrimages will resume by summer,

It is astounding to me—in the best possible way—that we have already shared a decade of ministry together. If you look at the plaque on the back wall of our Meeting House, you'll notice that our tenure now exceeds that of nine of the previous eighteen Senior Ministers. Together, we've journeyed through a richly blessed decade, including the challenge and opportunity of navigating a global pandemic.

During my sabbatical, I plan to take July and August away. My plans include extended time at Canandaigua Lake and Cuttyhunk Island, attending the UCC General Synod in Kansas City, and hiking portions of the Camino trail in Spain with Tammie. I'll share more detailed plans as the time for my departure approaches.

I truly cherish the feeling that all my time and abilities are fully utilized in ministry with you. I feel so blessed to witness the remarkable work the Spirit of God is leading us into together.

While I look forward to this season of rest and renewal, I am equally excited about the future work this sabbath and sabbatical time will prepare us for in the years ahead.



For over three decades, The Congregational Church of New Canaan has been committed to creating a community where youth can experience and share the love of God. Together, we walk with Christ all year to nurture a youth ministry marked by love, covenant, and active participation.

This February, 105 of our YG Fish will embark on a mission pilgrimage to Waco, Texas, to partner with Mission Waco and Grassroots in serving those in need. This year, our work will focus on building tiny homes for the unhoused population of Waco and supporting critical home repair projects for community members facing poverty. Each afternoon, our youth will also lead Bible camps for local children, fostering connection, faith, and hope across generations. Mission Waco has been a beacon of transformation for the Waco community, creating sustainable solutions for housing, education, and community empowerment. We are eager to support their work!

YG provides a space for the Spirit to move, offering our youth the chance to deepen their relationship with God and one another. Today, we humbly ask you to join us to walk with us as a mission sponsor, offering your prayers and resources to support this initiative. Our goal is to raise \$100,000, which will ensure that every mission fish can participate, regardless of financial circumstances, while also covering housing, food, and materials for the projects – which includes the sponsoring of three tiny homes. 




February Plate Collection - Open Doors
