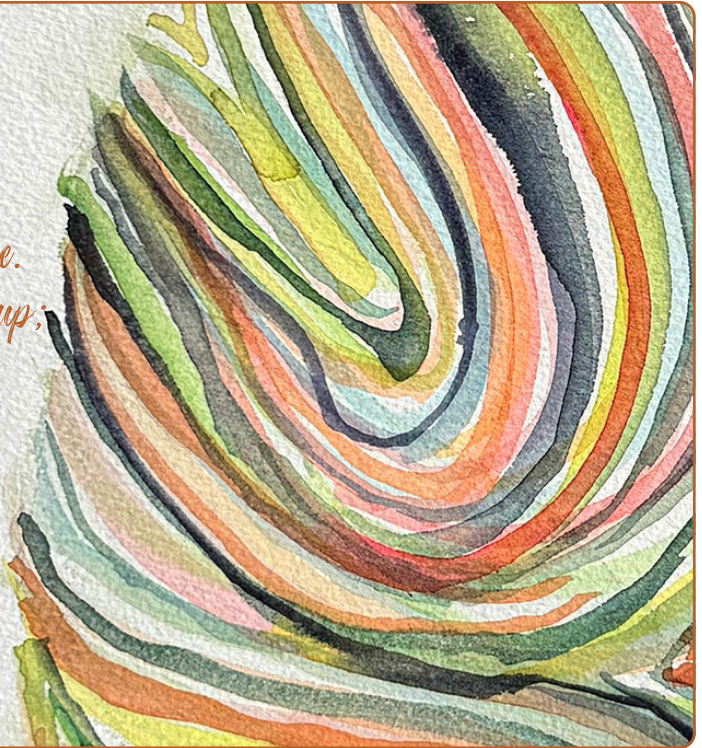

FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

There is no way that in 1883, Deacon William E. Raymond could have imagined how excited a future pastor of The Congregational Church of New Canaan would be 142 years after his original gift. Deacon Raymond's gift was generous and focused: he offered resources that would become an endowment that would help ensure the gospel of Jesus Christ was preached in underserved communities across Connecticut. He could not have envisioned what his generosity would produce in our own time—an extraordinary group of preachers training here at God's Acre this fall.

Thanks to the faithful stewardship of his bequest, our church now offers preaching fellowships to seminarians and lay leaders. Fellows receive rigorous training in the art and craft of preaching, and then bring the gospel message to congregations across Connecticut free of charge. These churches, often struggling to afford pulpit supply, are blessed by vibrant preaching—and the ripple effect of Deacon Raymond's gift continues 142 years later in local churches, in new cohorts of well-trained preachers, and even within our own congregation.

This fall, we welcomed six Raymond Fellows—three seminarians and three lay leaders. Each brings extraordinary gifts to the pulpit:

- **Benji Suprice** – a Yale Divinity student from Boston, preaching since he was 13, passionate about justice and hospitality.
- **Eliana Cañas Parra** – also at Yale, originally from Colombia, a gifted teacher, pastoral leader, and now our seminarian intern.
- **Rev. Elyon Wells** – a Bridgeport native, pastor, author, and community leader, balancing ministry, study, and family.



Alongside them, lay preachers Marianna Kilbride, Tony Kiniry, and Khanisha Moore bring their creativity, spiritual depth, and real-world experience into the pulpit.

After our first two "Sermon Studio" gatherings this fall, I was floored by the quality of their work. I invited our Trustees and Leadership Team to see for themselves. "You've absolutely got to hear these preachers," I told them. "They're amazing."

Our Minnows will make cards for our boxes, our Guppies will make hot cocoa jars with marshmallows, and JYG will pack cookies in a jar mix for families served by the project. YG Fish will volunteer throughout the week in various ways, from helping with the younger ministries to unloading materials and food, and helping pack boxes on Sunday morning. Minnows (grades K & 1) make cards at normal program time 3:30-4:30pm.

Tuesday, November 18

Guppies (grades 2 & 3) make cocoa jars at the normal program time 4:30-5:30pm.

Thursday, November 20

JYG (grades 4 & 5) makes cookie in a jar mix at normal program time 5:00-6:00pm.

Sunday, November 23

MSYG (grades 6-8) is expected to be at the church by 9:45am to help the church schoolers prepare boxes during the service. They will help in church school from 10:00-11:00am. This is a covenant event for all MSYG fish traveling on the Mountainside trip in May.

YG traveling Mission Fish are expected to sign up either as individuals to help fill one of the volunteer slots during the week or with their families to deliver the completed Thanksgiving boxes on Sunday afternoon. We kindly ask that if you have multiple children in the program, please plan to help deliver boxes. Drivers/Families should pull into the front circle during your allocated time slot, where you will be greeted by a YG advisor who will tell you what local non-profit you are delivering to. To share them with you, we've scheduled our seminarians to preach during the season of Advent. Some have asked, "Shouldn't you be preaching as we kick off the season of Advent?" My emphatic answer: "These preachers are fantastic, and I want our congregation to hear them and know them, because we are having a direct role in their formation." As Jesus said, no one lights a lamp and hides it under a bushel, but on a lamp stand for all to see. We're putting this light — these preachers and our program — on a stand for all to see.

Deacon Raymond's legacy is a clear and compelling reminder that what we give today will shape tomorrow. He could never have known how his gift would inspire a program like this, but because he left a portion of his estate to the church, generations of preachers and congregations are being blessed.

This is why your annual giving—and your legacy giving—matters so much. Every pledge, every bequest, every act of generosity has the power to bear fruit far beyond what we can imagine today. Stewardship is not just about keeping the lights on—it's about fueling ministries that can light the world! It's about creating possibilities for the Spirit to do what only God can do: take our offering and multiply it into blessings.

Our Dove Donations

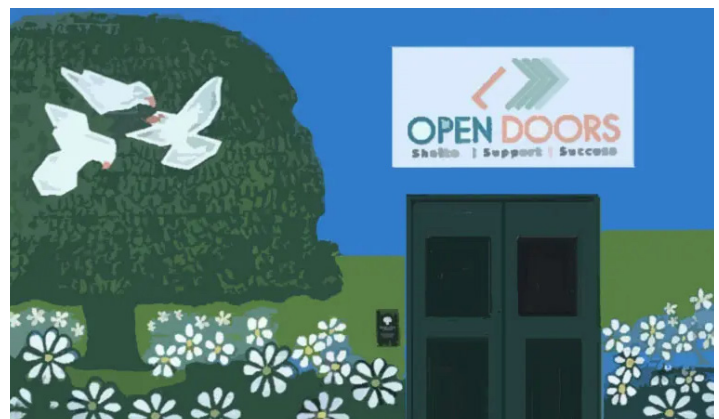
