

FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Dear Church Family,

I want to take a few moments to share with you two ministry developments that I am genuinely excited about—both of which offer us meaningful opportunities to help shape the future of our church together. But before I get to those opportunities, I want to begin with a reality that is never far from my heart and mind as a pastor.

Mainline Protestant churches like ours are facing extraordinary challenges across the country. The statistics are sobering. Since the founding of the United Church of Christ in 1957, the denomination has declined from more than 8,000 congregations to fewer than 4,500. Membership has fallen from over 2 million members to under 700,000. In many places, churches are closing, clergy shortages are growing, and the pipeline of younger pastors entering ministry has become alarmingly small.

Those numbers are difficult. And yet, they also clarify something important: churches like ours cannot simply drift into the future. We must pray, discern, imagine, and actively prepare for it.

One of the things I think many people do not fully realize is that, by nearly every meaningful measure—membership, worship attendance, mission engagement, programming, generosity, and staffing—our church is an extraordinary outlier within the life of the UCC. Quite honestly, there are very few churches

in our denomination with ministries as expansive and vibrant as our own. That is not something to boast about; it is something to steward faithfully and gratefully.

And that leads me to the first development I want to share.

As we move toward our 300th anniversary in 2031, we are preparing to enter a Season of Discernment together as a congregation. It is astonishing

to realize that we are caretakers of a community of faith that has worshiped, served, prayed, baptized, buried, and proclaimed the Gospel for nearly three centuries. Very few institutions in this country can claim such continuity and faithfulness.

The question before us now is not simply how we celebrate our history. The deeper question is this: How do we prepare this church for a faithful and vital fourth century of ministry? That question excites me deeply.

In the Congregational tradition, we believe that the Holy Spirit speaks through the gathered community. We believe wisdom is not reserved for clergy alone, but that the Spirit of God can speak through a minority of one person. Which means this

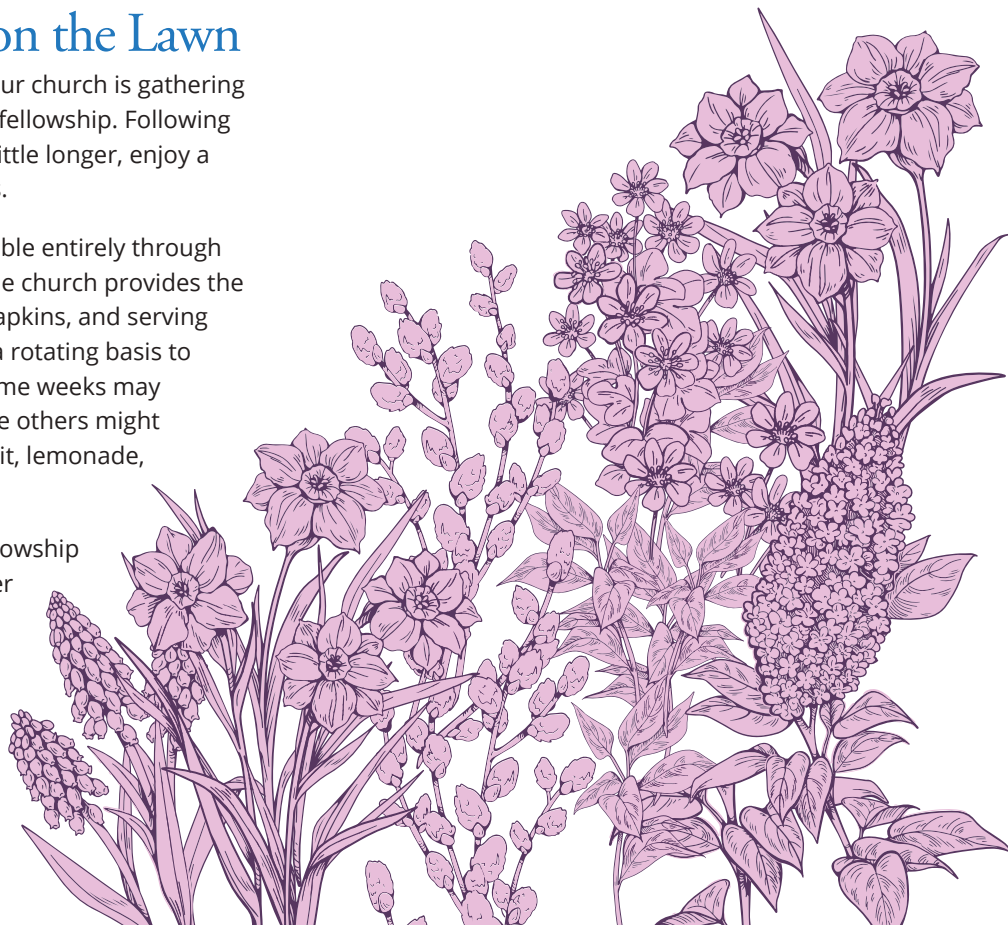

Important Update Regarding Your Digital Giving

The church has recently upgraded our giving tools through our existing partner, Pushpay. This change is designed to make your giving experience much more intuitive, secure, and flexible. Here are a few details that might be helpful as you navigate the new system.



There are three simple ways you can use Pushpay moving forward.

- First, you can give online by visiting our church website and clicking on the GIVE button.
- Second, you can text to give by sending the word GIVE to (833) 474-7983 to receive a direct link.
- Third, you can use the QR code by simply scanning it wherever you see it displayed.

Once you are on the new page, you can easily set your gift amount, choose your giving frequency, and select the specific fund you would like to support.

For our recurring givers, if you already have a recurring donation set up, there is absolutely nothing you need to do. Your gifts have automatically transferred into our new system.

process will only be as rich and faithful as the willingness of the congregation to participate in it. And I truly believe there is reason for hope.

One of the great temptations in difficult times is to become defensive, nostalgic, or fearful. But the Holy Spirit is rarely interested in preserving comfort. The Spirit moves. The Spirit surprises. The Spirit leads communities into places they never imagined they could go.

My hope is that this season of discernment will not merely help us preserve a church but help us discover what kind of church God is calling us to become for the generations that follow us.

The second development I want to share is one of the most hopeful signs I have seen in years.

This summer, we are launching our first cohort of collegiate preachers' young adults from our church community who feel drawn to learning the craft and calling of preaching. In a moment when fewer and fewer young people are exploring ministry, I cannot tell you how encouraging it is to have young adults eager to study Scripture, wrestle with theology, and proclaim the Word of God.

I will be working closely with this group over the summer, helping them develop sermons and explore the art and discipline of preaching. And toward the end of the summer, several of these young preachers will likely offer messages in worship.

Now, I know many of us become accustomed to worship feeling a certain way and to hearing familiar voices from the pulpit. I understand that impulse completely. But I want to encourage all of us to see these moments not as interruptions to worship, but as investments in the future of the Church.

If we truly desire a future filled with thoughtful, faithful, courageous pastoral leadership, then we must create space for young people to discover and exercise those gifts. Encouraging young preachers is not separate from the mission of the church—it is essential to it.

Frankly, one of the clearest signs of spiritual vitality in any congregation is whether younger generations can imagine themselves serving there and leading there. And thanks be to God, that is happening here.

So, I really am asking all of us to lean into this next season together—a season that includes real challenges but also remarkable opportunities for imagination, adventure, growth, and renewal.

Participate in the discernment process. Bring your wisdom, your questions, your prayers, and your hopes. And if we happen to have some young preachers standing in our pulpit this summer, come ready not merely to evaluate them, but to encourage them, pray for them, and celebrate the possibility that God may be raising up a new generation of leaders right here on God's Acre.

That, to me, feels like hope.

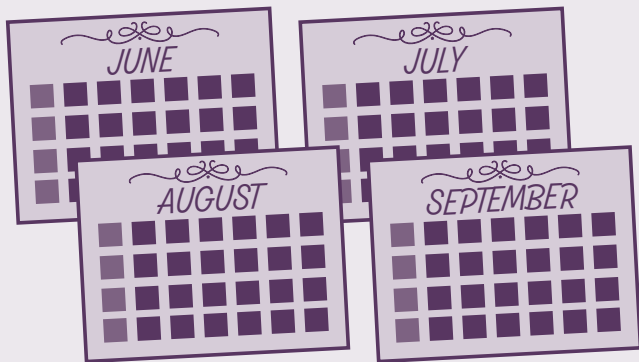

Updates from YG Mission Trip 2025

We have some very exciting updates from our partners at Mission Waco! In 2025, YG traveled to Waco, Texas, to serve alongside Mission Waco as they began the process of building Creekside Community Village. YG, along with the immeasurable help from our mission sponsors, was able to build three of the first community homes in the village. We received an update from our partners at Mission Waco that they have begun moving neighbors into the homes and will very soon have all our 35 homes filled! At full capacity, they hope to provide homes for over 300 formerly homeless individuals and will provide wrap-around services with existing Mission Waco programs and partners to keep them off the streets and in the community. We wanted to share this incredible news with the community to showcase the hard work of our YG fish and to honor the way the spirit has continued to move in this amazing community. July MSA Spotlight - PEHT

The Partnership to End Human Trafficking (PEHT) is a nonprofit organization that began in 2016 due to a need that arose in our community. Our location along the I-95 corridor and the proximity to New York and Massachusetts make it a regular location for human trafficking activity. PEHT provides survivors of trafficking with a pathway toward healing and independence through community outreach, residential recovery, and economic empowerment. Their program is divided into three categories. They embrace survivors with a trauma-informed residential program as well as community-based services for those who can't be housed. PEHT offers food, medical, and mental health services, education, legal assistance, and transportation assistance. They educate the local community and service providers on trafficking, including how to identify, prevent, and avoid it. They empower survivors by offering employment. PEHT has a shop in Fairfield where survivors manufacture and distribute products. Survivors receive job

training and financial literacy training. PEHT serves Fairfield County and the greater Hartford area, and it is the only provider of its kind in Connecticut. They are one of the newer partners to our church community, but a very worthwhile one. For more information and volunteer opportunities, contact Beth Picard at bpicard44@gmail.com.



August MSA Spotlight - Filling In The Blanks

In 2026, Filling in the Blanks (FITB) continues its mission to fight childhood food insecurity by providing children in need with reliable access to nutritious food on the weekends. What began as a small organization feeding 50 children in one school has grown into a robust program serving over 10,000 children across 203 sites throughout Fairfield, Putnam, and Westchester Counties every weekend.

Through our signature Weekend Meal Bag Program, FITB distributes bags filled with healthy, easy-to-prepare food to children who may otherwise go without meals when school is not in session. In addition, our Fresh Food on the Move mobile pantry delivers fresh produce, dairy, proteins, and pantry staples directly into underserved communities in Norwalk, Stamford, Bridgeport, and now Danbury. The mobile pantry also partners with local organizations to provide wraparound services, including healthcare resources, and financial literacy information, family support, and more.

In 2026, FITB expects to deliver over 1.3 million meals to children and distribute over 1 million pounds of fresh food to families experiencing food insecurity. This work is made possible through the generosity of community partners, volunteers, corporate supporters, schools, and faith-based organizations like The Congregational Church of New Canaan, which dedicates their time and resources to help neighbors in need.



FITB is committed to creating meaningful opportunities for community engagement. Volunteers 14 years or older can participate in packing events at the warehouse, 16 or older at our mobile pantry, and people of all ages can host a snack bag event. We also have two key events approaching: our family-friendly Unite to Fight 5K on August 23 in Stamford and Plates with Purpose Gala on October 16 at the Italian Center in Stamford. 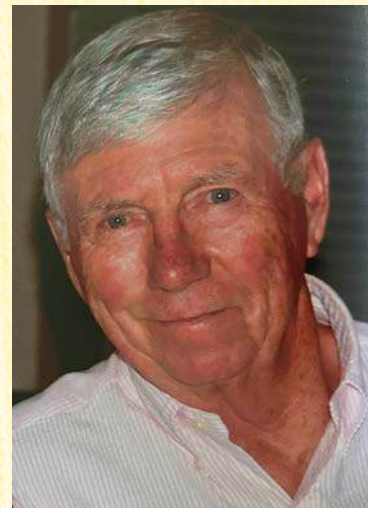
